A Message from Pastor Sophy ~

Dear BUMC Beloveds,

As we step into the heart of February, we find ourselves at a unique intersection of the calendar. The season of Epiphany, when we encounter revelations of Christ's divine nature and majesty, gives way to the long season of Lent— a solemn time of prayerful introspection, meditation, and preparation for Easter. Ash Wednesday ushers us into a dual encounter with our mortality and our need for forgiveness, reconciliation, and God's grace. Our journey through Lent towards Holy Week and Easter calls us to practices of confession and repentance as we consider the ways we have fallen short of God's call to love our neighbors and be peacebuilders for God's Kingdom.

Our Sunday Worship in February and March will be centered on two core themes: *Welcoming* and *Peacebuilding*. For the first three weeks of February, we'll explore how God calls Christians into practices of bold Biblical welcome and radical hospitality towards strangers, neighbors, and each other. Later, as we begin our journey to Holy Week and Easter through the season of Lent, we'll dig into the stories of Jesus' earthly ministry to discover what it means to be peacebuilders in our own time. This journey is one we are meant to walk together, and I invite you to do so by checking out any of the fellowship, scripture study, prayer, worship, faith-based advocacy, and community care opportunities shared in this newsletter. Read a little further to find the worship details for Ash Wednesday, the Wednesday night Lenten Services, and Holy Week.

Beloveds, we are living in a season of history that requires our moral attention, spiritual witness, and commitment to living out some of the highest ideals of Christian life: safeguarding human dignity, building beloved community, and working together for peace, justice, and the common welfare of all. At a time when people are quick to pick a side, cast blame, and declare some people more worthy of safety and dignity than others, we are called as Christians to practice a radical welcome of all people. In a world that is increasingly violent, chaotic, and cruel, we are called as Christians to be peacebuilders. *So Beloveds, let us learn the things that make for peace, from the One who is called the Prince of Peace.*

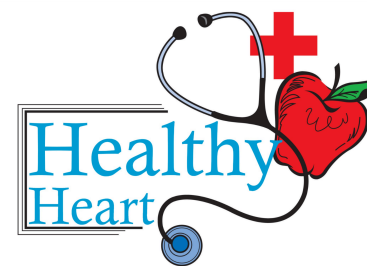


Bensalem Christian Day School

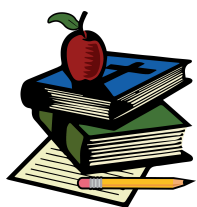

Happy 100th Anniversary! February Is



2026 marks an important US milestone, the 100th anniversary of federal recognition for Black Americans. What began as a singular week of learning and recognition called Negro History Week in 1926 is now an annual month-long celebration of achievements by African Americans and a time to recognize their role in U.S. history. It is a time to honor the contributions and legacy of African Americans - from activists and civil rights pioneers to leaders in industry, politics, science, culture and more.

The architect of this movement was Dr. Carter G. Woodson, a historian and educator, who holds the distinction of being the second African American to receive a Ph.D. from Harvard University, following W.E.B. Du Bois. Dr. Woodson, the son of formerly enslaved parents, understood that denying people of their history denies them of their humanity. To combat that, he launched Negro History Week to coincide with the February birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass, the two figures he felt were most tied to African American freedom.

His goal was to integrate Black history into the educational curriculum, public libraries, local churches, and communities at large across the nation. He designed the week to be a permanent shift in how America viewed and understood itself.

For 40 years, it was embraced by educators, elaborated upon by churches, and programming was built around it by civic groups, museums, libraries and other organizations.

In 1976, the United States, under President Gerald Ford, formally expanded the recognition into **Black History Month** with the essence of Woodson's vision remaining unchanged: Black history is part of American history.

The 100-year anniversary prompts reflection not only on what has been accomplished, but also on why this work continues to matter.

Black History Month is often associated with familiar icons - Martin Luther King, Jr, Rosa Parks, Malcolm X, Harriet Tubman - yet the deeper intention is about uncovering thousands of stories once ignored: scientists, entrepreneurs, artists, academics, inventors, policy leaders, soldiers, and everyday citizens who shaped the nation.

For students, leaders, and global citizens, Black History Month is not simply a date on the calendar; it is a powerful reminder to recognize the generations who fought for inclusion in the historical record, even when

our nation resisted acknowledging their humanity. It is about building cultural competency, learning from systemic injustice, and developing the leadership skills required in an increasingly diverse world.

And as the world pauses in 2026 to honor a century of commemoration, the message remains as clear — and necessary — as ever:

Black history is American history. Remembering it strengthens us all.
